Lesson Activities

- Pupils log on to computers and enter website address: www.capetown.gov.za Follow the link to the 2010 World Cup.
- Pupils research what Cape Town is doing to plan for the World Cup, seeing how Cape Town is addressing the problems raised last lesson.
- On the sheet of sugar paper, pupils identify the problem and then the details of any solutions from the official website.
- The pupils will produce a display of the planning.
- Compare this to the sheets they completed in Activity 2, detailing the problems and solutions they came up with.
- Hand out news articles highlighting problems of the World Cup and discuss how valid the pupils think the views are.

Outcomes

All pupils to:

- Identify Cape Town's solutions

Most pupils to:

- Be able to compare these solutions to their own from Activity 2

- Give opinion on the future success of these solutions
